

Sports Premium Expenditure: St Joseph's Catholic Primary School

Report: Academic Year 2014 – 2015

Statement

The DfE have made available funding of £8,000 per school and £5 per pupil to promote and develop the teaching of primary PE and increase opportunities for inter-school sport and competition.

Funding period

The additional funding will be paid to eligible schools in the academic years 2013 to 2014 and 2014 to 2015.

Summary and Objectives of Pupil Premium Spending

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Summary of spending and actions taken:

The following plan for this year has been formulated. The key principle is that we build upon the knowledge and quality of PE teaching by our staff by bringing in a specialist P.E teacher for one day a week to teach alongside the class teacher. This will upskill the class teacher. In addition, we are increasing the range and diversity of sports being offered as well as drawing on expertise locally from within our Partnership, as well as county.
