

## Sports Premium Expenditure: St Joseph's Catholic Primary School, Thame

### Report: Academic Year 2016 – 2017

#### Statement

The Government is providing funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2016-17 to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school Head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

Below are the details of how we spent the funding for the 2016- 17 Academic Year

#### Overview of School

#### Summary of spending and actions taken:

We started the academic year by buying in instructors to train teachers and TA's in developing a Growth Mindset culture within school, which essential for success in sport and transferable to pupil's attitudes to learning. This took place in July 2016 and we used previous year's PE Sports' Funding at a cost of £1,270.

The old PE shed doors have been replaced and the interior refurbished in order to protect our existing PE Equipment from the weather and in preparation for new equipment to be purchased 2017-18.

The Summer Sport's week saw specialist coaches coming into school to deliver to our children and upskill teachers in the teaching of Cricket, Martial Arts & Yoga.

We have explored the possibility of a big PE project such as installing a "Miracle Mile" surface to be placed around the school grounds.
