Evaluation of the impact of funding 2016/17

The percentage of pupil premium children achieving GLD was 80% compared with a national average of 71%. There was a gap off 1% between the attainment of pupil premium children and other children in school with 81% of other children achieving GLD.

The percentage of children passing the Year One Phonics check was 67%, which is broadly in line with the LA average.

The achievement overall in Reading, Writing in KS1 was above national average. In Mathematics it was in line with national average.

Achievement at the end of KS2 for pupil premium children was above the national average in Reading, Writing and Mathematics.

Summary

In this cycle of additional Pupil Premium funding, the evidence

gathered through the school's self-evaluation strategy has shown that the intervention strategies have been successful and have had a positive impact on progress, standards and achievement for the children receiving Pupil Premium.

Curriculum focus of PPG spending 2017/18

- Small group intervention support focusing on raising attainment in reading
- Small group intervention support focusing on raising attainment in phonics and spelling
- Small group intervention support focusing on raising attainment in maths.
- Booster group support to raise attainment national standard and greater depth than national standard in Reading, Writing and Maths for all Y6 pupils.
- Nurture provision for pupils focusing on Boxall Profile targets.
- Small group support for emotional health and well being.
- Additional booster support for Reception children.
