Project	<p>Your project for Autumn 2 is to construct a collage or draw a picture of the Yangtze River in China. You could use newspaper clippings, photos or magazine clippings to draw and make your collage or you could draw or paint the picture.</p> <p>First you will need to decide how you are going to draw your picture - you could use the internet to help you research about the Yangtze River, then begin making your collage!</p> <div style="text-align: center;">  </div> <p>Finally, find the answer to these questions about the geography of China and compare it to the UK, in your homework folder.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. What is the population of China and what is the population of the UK? 2. What rivers flow through China? What rivers flow through the UK? 3. What is the longest river in China? What is the longest river in the UK? 4. What different languages do they speak in China? What languages are spoken in the UK? 5. Which are the 5 biggest cities in China? Which are the 5 biggest cities in the UK? 6. What animals are native to China? What animals are native to the UK? <p>What I'm looking for:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Answer 5 questions about China and the UK. • Write them on paper and place into your homework folder, or present in a more creative way e.g. powerpoint presentation. • Make a collage of the Yangtze River using your own choice of materials. • Discuss your collage and how you made it. <p>Please return your model by Monday 11th December we are excited to see what you all create!</p>
Maths	The maths skill you will be focussing on this half term is times tables, measures and multiplication and division. You will need to practise your times tables, including 7, 8, 9, 11 and 12. You will also need to practise working out the length of objects in mm, cm, m, km. This can be done in your homework folder. Purple Mash and Education City can be used to practice times tables or work on measures, multiplication and division.
Reading	Try and read with your child at least 3 times per week . Your child's reading record must be signed, dated and returned to school daily. You could read your school book, a newspaper, a cook book, a magazine or an article on the internet.
Spelling	Spellings will be given out at the beginning of each week for your child to practise. Every Monday your child will have a spelling test to check their knowledge of spelling rules and patterns.
