Pupil Premium Summary: 2017-2018

Pupil Premium is the additional funding schools receive to support 'vulnerable pupils' to enjoy and achieve in line with all other children. This includes pupils who are entitled to free school meals (or have been at some point in the last six years), children in care or who have been adopted from car and children from service families.

The government believes that allocating Pupil Premium funding is the best way to ensure funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most. It is up to schools to decide how the Pupil Premium is spent.

The following information enables parents to see how much funding the school is receiving, how the school is spending the money and its impact on attainment and progress of pupils.

Please note that the funding we receive is not sufficient to provide all of this support for all pupils; the support is allocated according to need. However, all pupils entitled to Pupil Premium can access funding to take part in an after-school club, trips, residential camps and subsidised music lessons.

At Hotwells, we ensure that all children receive the support they need to succeed, regardless of whether or not they are entitled to Pupil Premium. The progress of all pupils is closely monitored and the progress of pupils entitled to Pupil Premium is monitored as a separate group.

If you think your child may be entitled for Free School Meals, PLEASE APPLY, even if your child prefers to bring packed lunch to school or is eligible for Universal Free School Meals (Key Stage 1).
