Acceptable Internet Use Agreement/E-Safety rules

The internet, email and mobile technologies are an important part of learning. As part of our curriculum, we regularly discuss internet safety with the children, as we expect them to be safe and responsible when using any computing devices. Our full E-Safety Policy is available to view on the school website.

This is the Acceptable Internet Use Agreement for you to discuss with your child:

- Computing in school must only be used for school purposes.
- Only use your own school email address, if applicable, when emailing.
- Only open email attachments from people you know, or who your teacher has approved.
- Don't tell other people your computing passwords.
- Only open/delete your own files.
- Make sure that all computing communications contact with other children and adults are responsible, polite and sensible.
- Don't deliberately look for, save or send anything that could be unpleasant or nasty. If you accidentally find anything like this, tell your teacher immediately.
- Don't give out your personal details such as your name, phone number, home address or school name.
- Meeting someone you have been in touch with online can be very dangerous. Only meet someone you have met online with parents' or carers' permission and even then only when they can be present.
- Your use of computing is monitored and your parent/ carer will be contacted if a member of school staff is concerned about your E-Safety.

S SAFE Keep safe by being careful not to give out personal information – such as your full name, email address, phone number, home address, photos or school name – to people you are chatting with online.

M MEETING Meeting someone you have only been in touch with online can be dangerous. Only do so with your parents' or carers' permission and even then only when they can be present.

A ACCEPTING Accepting emails, IM messages, or opening files, pictures or texts from people you don't know or trust can lead to problems – they may contain viruses or nasty messages!

R RELIABLE Information you find on the internet may not be true, or someone online may be lying about who they are.

t TELL Tell your parent, carer or a trusted adult if someone or something makes you feel uncomfortable or worried, or if you or someone you know is being bullied online.
