

Background

In April 2013, the Government announced new funding to provide new and substantial primary school sport funding. The government has committed funding for future years. Schools have to spend the sport funding on improving the provision of P.E. and sport, but have the freedom to choose how to do this.

Our School

We aim to use the funding by making high quality P.E. sustainable in Sherburn Hungate Primary School. We will do this by employing specialist coaches to work alongside teachers and teaching assistants in lessons to increase their subject knowledge and confidence in P.E.

We pay for teachers to be released from class to attend courses for professional development in P.E. and sport.

We strive to give our children the opportunity to participate in more physical activity by running after school clubs and attending festivals organised for our local cluster of schools. We provide a range of activities designed to meet the needs of the less active children in our school by bringing in a range of different and appealing activities.

We are working in partnership with six other primary schools in our area to fund the employment of a School Sports Leader, whose job it will be to organise festivals for our children and to help us find coaches to deliver high quality P.E.

Review

In the financial year 2016/2017 we have received £8813.00.

Throughout the last year the money has been used to employ coaches from Premier Sports, they have provided CPD for teachers and some TA'S. The areas covered include Football, Rugby, Basketball, Tennis, and Athletics. We have also provided CPD for some TA's and MSA's by running lunchtime clubs and activities which engage the children. In partnership with Sherburn High School and some of the primary schools within our cluster, the Sports Funding has paid for the services of a school sports coordinator. This has enabled children to attend a range of festivals including, Cross Country, Dance Festival, Tri-Golf, Multi-Skills and Swimming to name but a few. The funding has also been used to transport the children to these events and pay for a teacher to accompany the children. In total 114 children attended these festivals with a number of children attending more than 1.

At Sherburn Hungate, we endeavour to promote a healthy lifestyle and encourage the children to be active in the playground and on the playing field, outside of their PE lessons. In an attempt to do this we have replenished resources to replace worn out equipment, we have provided more opportunities by buying equipment such as football nets and basketball hoops and to provide the MSA'S with equipment for lunchtime play boxes. We have run lunchtime clubs and although this year we haven't trained Play Leaders, some Year 5 children have taken it upon themselves to support our younger children in doing this.

All of the children, from Year 1 to Year 6 have been given the opportunity to attend after school club which this year, have included basketball, dodgeball, archery and multi skills. These clubs were offered to the children free of charge by using the funding to employ coaches from Premier Sports. In total 126 children attended after school clubs.

Resources have been provided to enhance Early Years provision of P.E. curriculum.

We were awarded the Schools Games Bronze Mark in recognition of the things we have put in place for the children and staff of Hungate using the Sports Premium Grant.

We have purchased a scheme of work, KeySports, which teachers will use alongside the Val Sabin Scheme, to help them teach PE more effectively.

In the financial year 2017/2018 we have received £8855.

We will provide support/training for new members of staff or those who have moved age ranges.

We will strive to keep as many children active as possible by continuing to provide after school clubs for all.

We will also maintain a working relationship with Sherburn High School and some of the primary schools within our cluster, allowing the children to continue to participate in a number of cluster festivals.

We will look to purchase another scheme of work (IMoves) to enhance our PE provision as it allows teachers to use technology to show examples of good practise and provides music and resources which are required to provide high quality PE.
