## Panto and Church Visit

After several years of visiting the Cast in Doncaster for the Pantomime we have decided to invite a theatre company into school to perform Dick Whittington. Visits to the theatre are fantastic and are lovely experiences for all of the children but we are aware of the financial pressures that this places on parents. The visit from the Theatre Company is costing £12 less per 't have to pay any travel costs. We may return to the Cast next year. The cost for your pupil to watch the

performance is a voluntary contribution of £2.50.

For educational visits we are legally only allowed to request a voluntary contribution. The contribution covers the cost of the visits if all pupils pay. We never ever run in profit for any trip and often run at a loss. If contributions are ever too low we do cancel them as the school cannot financially subsidise them as this puts pressure on other areas of the school budget.

On the final Friday (22nd December) we will be holding our final presentation assembly of the year at 9:00am in the school hall. In the afternoon we will be leaving the school at 1:30pm to visit St. Leonard's Church (opposite Aldi) in Scawsby for our annual Carol Concert. The service is open to parents and lasts approximately 45 minutes. Children can be collected from the Church or school to start their Christmas Holiday early.

## Keeping in touch with school?

We work really hard at Sunnyfields to ensure that your child is safe, secure, makes progress and has fun. It is really nice to hear when you are happy with things at school as this is shared with the staff and governors. to your child's class teacher. If this does not help speak to the relevant phase leader. Again if you concern is not addressed speak to one of the senior leadership team or email the school office who will forward on your email.

## Christmas Lunch and Party Days

Christmas Lunch Day is on **Wednesday 20th December 2017**. Children who already have school dinners will automatically get a Christmas Lunch. For children who are normally on packed lunches they have the option to have a Christmas Lunch if they choose. The Christmas Dinner is served to the children by the teaching staff! The school office has sent out information about this. All children

no matter whether they have a Christmas Dinner or packed lunch will meet in the hall to have lunch together. On this day your child may wear a **Christmas Jumper** if they wish. There is no charge for this or any pressure to wear a Christmas jumper.

The children's Christmas Party Day is on **Thursday 21st December 2017**. Children will be provided with a party lunch before moving into their

classes for games and a disco. The lunch normally consists of pizza, hotdogs, chips, jelly and ice cream which is served by the staff. We invite parents to send in additional food including crisps and biscuits to make the Christmas Party even more fun for the children. As with the Christmas Dinner all pupils have the option to have a school party lunch rather than home packed lunches.

All school clubs start on the second week of term and end in the penultimate week of term.

## INSET Days and SATs

INSET days (In Service Training Days) are days set aside by the Department for Education that are additional to the 190 days of pupil education. The five additional days are for ongoing training of teaching staff. INSET days include internal training as well as training alongside colleagues from other schools. Therefore, pupils do not miss any learning when staff are participating in INSET.

We have taken one INSET day in September .

The remaining INSET days where will be closed to children are on:

- Monday 19th February 2017
- Friday 25th May 2017
- Monday 4th June 2017
- Monday 23rd July 2017

The Y6 SAT week is on **14th May-18th May 2017** and Y1 Phonics week commences on **11th June 2017**. Absence **MUST BE** avoided during this time as children will not be able to take the tests at a later time. The test data is used to support next steps in learning, inform next steps for pupils at secondary school and are part of the measure used to measure the school.

## The Friends of Sunnyfields

The Friends of Sunnyfields is a groups of parents and staff that work throughout the year to raise funds for our children. The FoS hold a number of events throughout the year including fashion shows, children's discos, Christmas Fayre, and Summer Fayre.

They fundraise for resources and equipment that is not normally supported by the school budget.

Over the years the FoS have raised funds for picnic benches on the playgrounds, new play equipment, playsuits for Foundation children, stages and disco lights.

the special items that help make the school such a nice place to be. The FoS welcomes support from parents, carers, grandparents, aunt and uncles.

## Pupil Safety

At the end of the school day pupils are taken to different areas of the playground. It helps greatly if parents can congregate in the middle of the KS2 playground to allow classes to get to their Muster points safely.

Children will only be dismissed when a parent or carer can be seen by the class teacher or adult with responsibility for the class. Unfortunately, we have had some parents shouting for their children to join them to leave school without the staff seeing the carer. Although it may seem that this process is slow it is for the safety of your children.

For parents who wish to complain please speak to Mr. Richardson, Mr. Crosby or Mrs. Gatt. The three senior leaders are responsible for pupil and site safety.
