HOMEWORK

Children are expected to read daily. Our younger readers should spend 10/15 minutes reading to an adult and discussing their book. As children become more fluent readers, they should be encouraged to spend some time reading quietly on a daily basis.

Children from Reception to Year 6 will receive weekly Phonics or Spelling Homework.

Children from Year 1 to Year 6 are expected to learn times tables/number bonds/mathematical facts every week.

MyMaths online homework is set weekly for children in Years 1-6.

Each term the children will be asked to complete a number of 'interactive' homework activities from a 'Homework Menu'. They can choose from 12 different tasks requiring different skills and aptitudes. The children can work through the homework at their own pace, the proviso being that a minimum number of tasks are completed each term (usually about one every three weeks). We encourage parents to be enthused and help with these tasks and would value your feedback in their homework books.
