<u>Outcomes:</u> The progress and attainment of pupils eligible for free school meals throughout the school is broadly in line with other pupils both in school and nationally and sometimes exceeds it. Therefore PPG is effectively used to narrow the gap and ensure that disadvantaged pupils .
