We like our children to wear school uniform because we feel that it helps them to identify with the school, look smart and to take pride in being a member of the school community. It is easier to identify ourselves as a group with shared values and reinforces our view that everyone is equally important. School uniform can be purchased from most clothes shops/supermarkets so long as it is consistent with our policy. Clothing branded with the school logo can be purchased from the National School Wear Centre in New Milton - PMGSchoolwear, although an embroidered crest is not an obligatory part of our uniform.

Our Uniform consists of:

- Royal blue sweatshirt or sweat cardigan with/without the embroidered school logo
- White polo shirt with/without printed school logo
- Grey tailored school trousers or skirt/dress. Pupils may wear shorts in summer
- Light blue check summer dress
- Black Shoes

In addition to daily uniform, children require appropriate clothing for P.E, dance or gymnastics and an overall for art and craft lessons. Parents should ensure that sports kit is available in school every weekday throughout the year.

P.E. Kit consists of:

- Royal blue shadow stripe shorts
- White tee shirt with/without printed school logo
- Plimsolls indoors and trainers for outdoor PE
- Children should have dark tracksuits for games in winter

Footwear:

For reasons of safety, all shoes should fasten securely. Open toes, high heels, sling-backs, boots, trainers and other softer shoes are not appropriate for wearing in school. Children wearing inappropriate footwear will be asked to change into plimsolls for the rest of the school day.

Jewellery:

Wearing of jewellery in school is forbidden, with the exception of stud earrings which must be taped by the parent or carer for P.E. This is for Health and Safety reasons. Watches are permitted but must be removed for sports activities. Any jewellery other than stud earrings worn in school will be confiscated by the class teacher and taken to the Head Teacher. It will be placed in an envelope and held securely in the school safe. Parents will be asked to collect it from the Head Teacher.

Makeup and Nail Varnish:

Make up and nail varnish should not be worn to school.

Hairstyles:

Extreme hairstyles are not appropriate for school. The use of styling products should be kept to a minimum and children should not have decorative patterns cut into their hair or have hair coloured or dyed.

Parents are asked to label all items of clothing clearly.
