

# Semi-colons

A **semi-colon** can be used to separate two related main clauses which are of equal importance.



A main clause contains one idea or event, a verb and always makes sense on its own.



**Semi-colons** show the reader that there is a pause in the sentence that is longer than for a **comma** but shorter than for a **full stop**.



The film was amazing. We all had a great time!

The film was amazing; we all had a great time!

**Top tip!** Don't over-use semi-colons in your writing. Mix them up with conjunctions, e.g. and, so, but etc. and dashes in place of the pause.
