



Sports Premium Overview

“Making a difference to the lives of our children”

At Woolley Wood School we understand the important role physical exercise and participation in sporting activities has in contributing to the general health, wellbeing and development of the pupils in our school.

Our school has always had a strong commitment to physical development, the opportunities provided by the additional Sports Premium funding has further enhanced and strengthened the breadth and range of activities that we have been able to provide for our pupils.

In 2016/17 the total number of primary aged pupils at Woolley Wood School was **88** and this attracted a Sport Premium Grant of **£8,390**. For 2017/18 the anticipated Sport Premium Grant is (currently) expected to be **£8,400**. (*Anticipated to rise to **£16,800**)

We allocated the funding by the three key areas for consideration; Physical Education, Healthy Active Lifestyles and Competitive Sport. We have allocated the Sport Premium Grant against the projects listed below:
