TUESDAY	<p><u>Faith Festival/Celebrations Fair – Held in Hall</u> Year 5&6: 9.05 – 10.00 Year 3&4: 10.00 – 10.55 Year 1&2: 11.05 – 11.30 Exploring main festivals of major faiths: Christian (Eric Blowes); Jewish (Linda French); Muslim (Abdul Hafiz); Buddhist (School); Hindu/Sikh (Baldwinder Singh Badesha). Bases for each faith which will comprise information /artefacts of festivals and what they celebrate.</p> <p>Each class to do follow up work (age appropriate) in classroom related to similarities/differences between festivals, how and why they are celebrated. May be written, poetry, art etc</p>	<p><u>Storytelling/Drama</u> Creation stories of different religions</p> <p>Years R, 1 and 2: 1.30 – 2pm Years 3 and 4: 2 – 2.30pm Years 5 and 6: 2.30 – 3pm</p> <p>What do the creation stories have in common? What differences do children notice?</p> <p>Classes to start collecting ideas on their entry for the bake off (see Thursday below)</p>
WEDNESDAY	<p>Reception, Year 1, 2 and 3 – Timetable as usual <u>Question Time: 10.30 – 11.30 Held in Hall</u> Panel of representatives from different faiths: Abdul (Muslim); Jennifer (Humanist); Linda (Jewish); Andrew (Christian); Baldwinder (Sikh) Years 4 – 6 Representatives to explain in 3-4 mins what religious faith means to them, what values they hold dearest and where they get their guidance from Children then to have an opportunity to ask questions directed to a representative of their choice (some pre-prepared ones and some as a result of thoughts and ideas on the day).</p>	<p><u>Central Prayer and Reflection Space – All Day In Library</u> Suggest 10 min in small groups Year 6: 9 – 10am Year 2: 10 – 11 Year 3: 11 – 12 Year 4: 1 – 1.50 Year 5: 1.50 – 2.30 Year 1: 2.30 – 3.05 Focussed prayer and reflection on World Peace On display will have world map showing areas of conflict (stickers where they leave their thoughts); Powerpoint showing different symbols etc of peace, netting with gift tags for children to write thoughts/prayers on, music, lighting</p>
THURSDAY	<u>Inter-Faith Bake off Day</u>	

	<p>Teachers to have thought how this is to be done in their class. The class has to present a prepared food (cake, biscuit, etc) that has some significance to the faith they have been allocated (eg Buddhist faith could involve making a cake(s) decorated with lotus flower.</p> <p>The whole class or a group of children could bake on the day; a selected group could bake at home; could be heats within the class.... Does not have to involve baking!</p> <p>A group of children will present to the judges their class entry and give some information on the entry: why it was chosen, what ingredients were used, how it was make, who made it etc.</p> <p>Extended Writing linked to Inter Faith week</p> <p>Ideas:</p> <p>Creative writing (make up own creation story using commonalities identified)</p> <p>Poetry</p> <p>Including illustrations if they wish</p> <p>Use of symbols in the different religions</p> <p>Reflections on Question Time (incl what, if any, impact has the morning's session had on them)</p> <p>What does Faith mean to them?</p>
FRIDAY	<p><u>Whole School sharing Assembly and Judging of Bake Off</u></p> <p>9.30 – 10.30am</p> <p>Each class to bring their class bake-off entry ready to present</p> <p>Also to bring examples of any art work, writing, prayers to share with the school. Suggest choosing 5 or 6 children who are confident and eloquent.</p> <p>In addition, 2 children each from Years 4, 5 and 6 to talk about their views on the Question Time session and what they learnt from it.</p> <p>Prayers for World Peace</p>
