Sports Premium Funding Statement

October 2017

What is the Sports Premium?

The government made a pledge to spend over £450 million on improving physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools over the 3 academic years: 2013 to 2016. This funding was then approved to continue to the end of the academic year 2019 to 2020. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school Head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. For the current academic year funding has been significantly increased through the 'Sugar Tax' revenue.

Each eligible school with 17 or more pupils will receive £16,000 plus an extra £10 per pupil in Years 1-6.

For the academic year 2017 – 2018, Hotwells Primary School will receive approximately £18,000.

Purpose of the funding

Schools can spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport; there is freedom to choose how to spend it.

At Hotwells Primary School we recognise the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of the children. In addition, we believe that an innovative and varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all children.

We intend to use the funding to improve both curriculum and extra -curricular provision for all children, regardless of sporting ability.

Swimming

83% of the current Year 6 cohort swims competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres.
