	<p>school books but are encouraged to supplement their reading by exploring a range of texts at home. This will help them develop a love for reading and explore a variety of genres. Any texts your child chooses to read can be recorded in their reading diary.</p> <p>Spellings will be given on a Friday to be tested on the following Friday. It is very important for children to become good spellers and they will be tested on spellings related to their phonic, high frequency words and misconceptions. I also assess children's spelling in their independent writing therefore some spellings may be simple or often repeated to ensure children are correctly applying them consistently.</p>
