Pupil Premium

We received an additional sum of money directly from the Government in our delegated budget entitled Pupil Premium. In the academic year 2017 – 2018 we had 6% of the school population entitled to this support.

At Templewood we have used our Pupil Premium to impact on the standards and achievements of pupils throughout the school. We have focussed on providing extra interventions, including 1:1 tuition, small group work, counselling, educational trips and activities.
