Well done to the football team for their excellent effort against Mersey Drive Primary, winning 16-1. The team also recently won an away match against Our Lady of Lourdes.

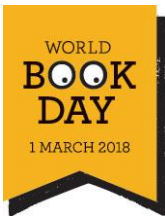
Robotics Day
