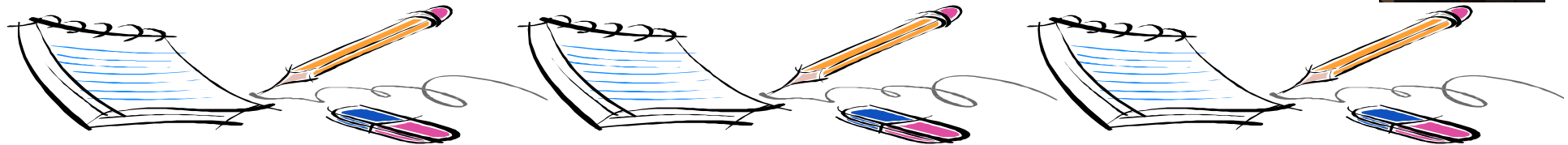
How the children change while they are with us

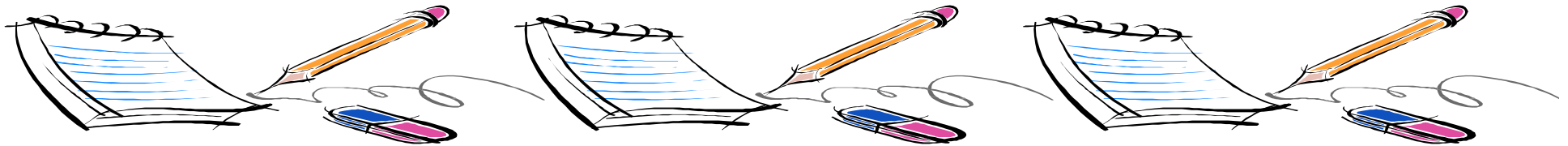


And just a word about home work

- Open – a task which is not in itself right or wrong but can be done in many ways and take as much time as you and your child want

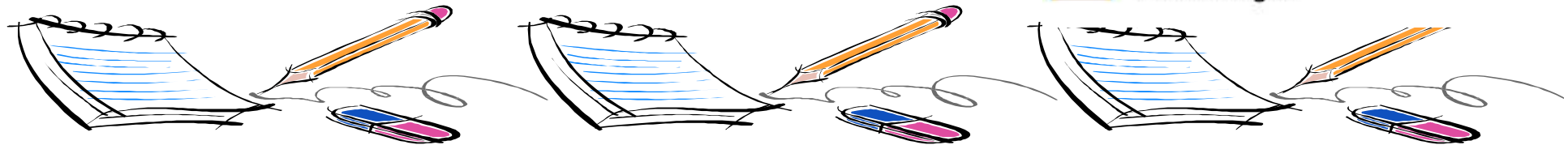
e.g. Choose a famous explorer and find out about him (or her)

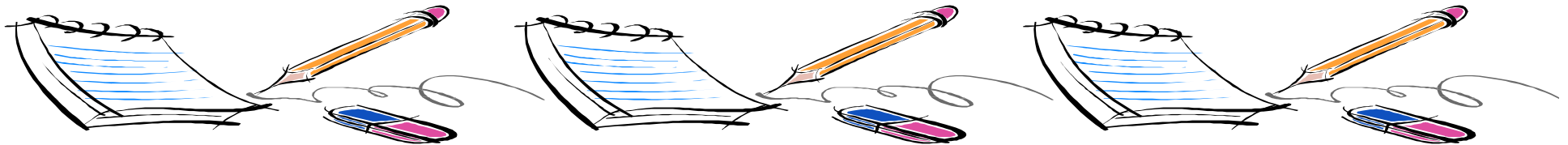
National Curriculum Expectations 2

BUT

National expectation is not enough - the political expectation is that we will have a significant number of pupils at above expected levels.

SO

- We do challenge the children to do their best and not be content with just enough
- We do work towards significant numbers of year 6 pupils achieving Level 5
- We do increasingly expect some children to be working at or close to Level 6



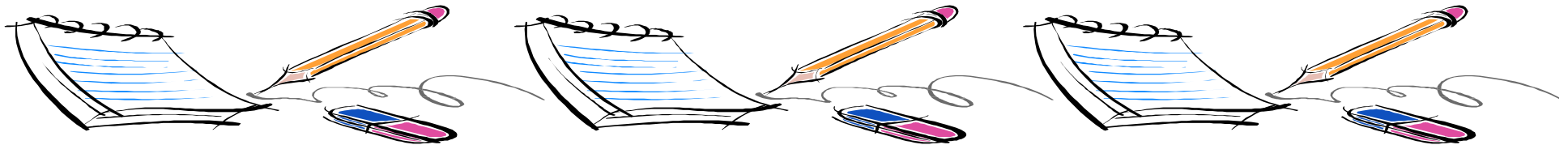
Assessments and Targets.

Assessment timetable:

- Y3 baseline assessment completed on entry.
- Y3-Y6 teacher assessment at the end of each term.
- Year 6 complete practice SATs half termly. SATs week will be second week in May 2014.

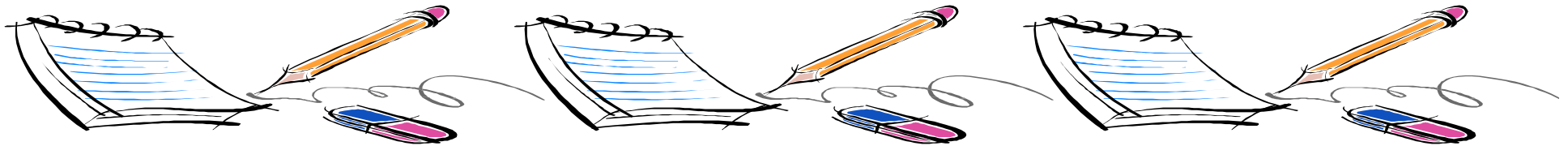
Teacher assessments are ongoing, along with other tests when necessary e.g. reading age.

TRACKED and ANALYSED**



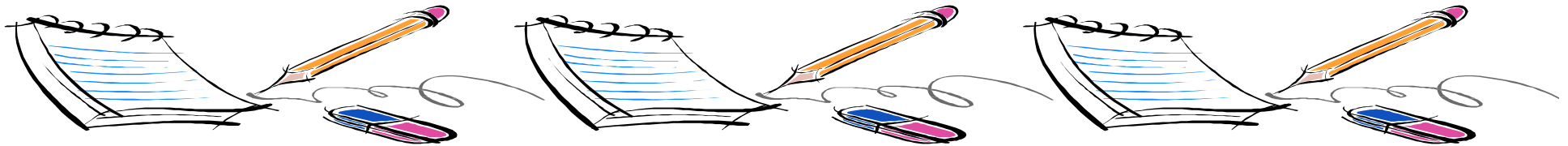
Marking and Feedback.

- ✓ Marking has sharp focus
- ✓ Focus is on the learning intention
- ✓ Pupils are expected to respond to marking
- ✓ Gives targets, pointers for improvement
- ✓ Can be written or oral
- ✓ Peer and self marking

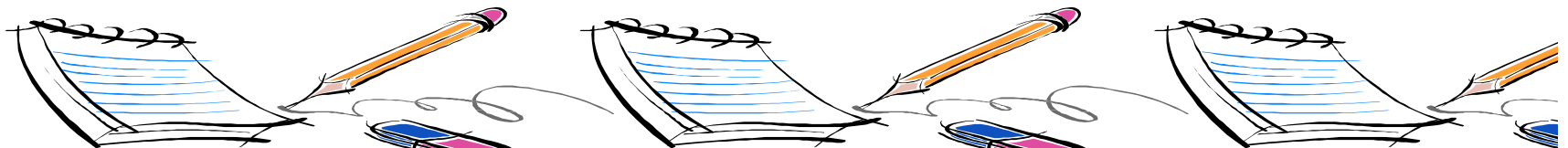

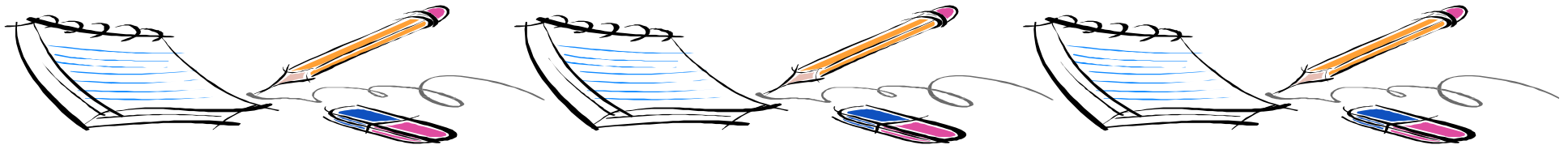

We want all pupils to reach their full potential, given their starting points and abilities.

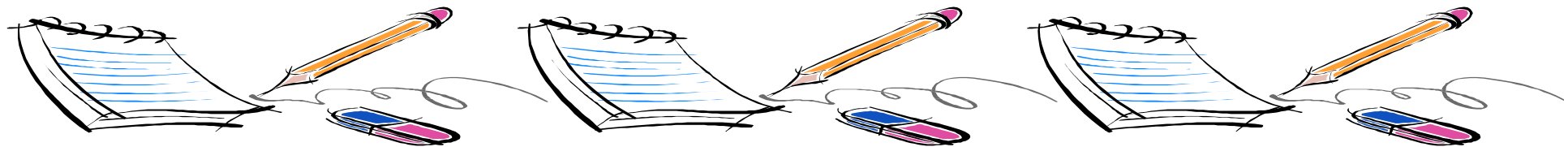

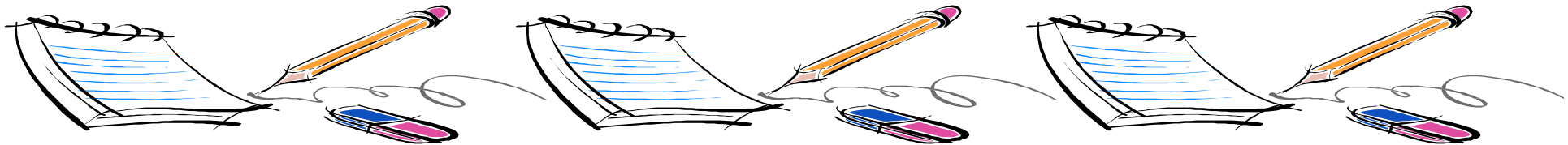
