What does this actually mean?

Children's achievement is significantly higher than 2016 but in reading and maths it is still below the National Standard (What the country achieves overall nationally). In writing, the children were above the National standard, which is brilliant.

Our progress scores are also improving. If you are above -5 for reading, -7 for writing and -5 for maths, this means that you are above the floor standard (Where the education department says you should be). As you can see, we are above the floor standard in all areas.

If children have a standardised score of 100, this means that they have met the standard. Overall, St Lawrence's children's average score was 100 or a little above. This means that most of our children were really close to, or met the score. Again, this is an improvement on the previous year, but we still need to make sure that more children are above the score of 100.

In summary, our children made expected or good progress from KS1 to KS2, but we still need to improve their achievement so that it is in line or better than National figures. We have made progress in all areas of the curriculum but there is still much work to do!
