Primary Sports Funding 2017-18

What is Primary Sports Funding?

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum for academic year 2015 to 2016 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport - will be allocated to primary school head teachers.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

How will the funding be spent?

At Cornholme Primary School, we have developed an action plan to ensure that the money is spent on initiatives which will have a long lasting impact on the future learning and physical development of children within our school.
