Discovering the history around us

Colchester's rich history was the subject of Year 6's guided tour of the town centre on Thursday 22nd February as they looked to add context to their knowledge of the English Civil War and the Siege of Colchester. Children were fascinated by the story of One-eyed Gunner Thompson and the devastation he caused before being blown off the tower of St Mary's church by cannon fire; and how the grass will never again grow on the spot that Royalists, Lucas and Lisle, met their grisly fate outside the castle; as well as many other stories from the excellent tour guides.

The children followed up the tour by writing a letter imagining they were trapped with the walls during the siege. Their excellent, personal writing made it very clear just how much they had learnt from this experience.

Bag 2 School

We are pleased to announce that Hamilton Primary has organised another clothes and shoe collection with Bag2School, something we have taken part in several times before.

Bag2School is the UK's leading textile recycler and fundraiser working with schools.

It helps the environment by helping to divert unwanted textiles away from landfill. A recent DEFRA report has shown that textile collection schemes are helping to reduce the volume of textiles discarded as municipal solid waste. However it is a fact that as a nation we still send 350,000 tonnes of textiles to landfill every year.

By getting involved in our Bag2School collection, you have an opportunity to sort through your cupboards and wardrobes and donate unwanted textiles in the bag provided-this can include adults' and children's clothes, shoes (tied together please), hats, belts, handbags and soft toys, (please refer to http:// uk.bag2school.com/ for full details). taking part it will raise awareness amongst the children of the benefits of recycling and reuse whilst also being a very different kind of fundraiser!

If you fill the donation bag and still have more then you can use any other bag to donate your items and don't forget to ask grandparents, friends and neighbours to have a sort out as well!
