**Summary of PPG Spending**

Spending in the Financial year 2017/18 will be targeted towards:

- **supporting the existing class structure**, in terms of Class Teacher and in-class Teaching Assistant staffing, so that children attracting PPG can continue to be taught in small classes with guaranteed additional challenge, attention and appropriate differentiation in the classroom;
- **substantial support for eligible children** at failing to achieve their potential;
- **the continued evaluation and provision of small group and one-to-one interventions** in Reading and Maths aimed at a) reducing any difference between PPG pupils and their peers and b) providing challenge for more able pupils;
- **subsidising the school trips** in Class 1 and Class 2, and the residential visit in Class 3 so that no families will be treated differently as a result of inability to pay;
- **subsidising access** to surf and instrumental music lessons;
- **further building emotional resilience** and self-esteem particularly for children who are going through, or have gone through, difficult personal experiences; and
- **supporting pupils who are vulnerable** at transition.

**How the impact will be measured**

- Comparisons between the attainment of children eligible for PPG and other children, at the end of KS2 and at key points across the school (ie YR, Y2 and Y4) to be favourable.
- The difference between the achievement of eligible children and others at Y6 to be further reduced.
- Able children who are eligible for PPG to be identified and appropriately challenged.
- Eligible children who are receiving targeted intervention in either Literacy or Maths to make measurable progress.
- The uptake of the subsidies available for class trips and residential to be universal.
- The participation in extra-curricular fee-paying activities by eligible children to be increased.
- The attendance of eligible pupils to match or exceed that of other children.
- Feedback on emotional support groups and sessions to be universally popular and be acknowledged by parents and carers to be promoting self-esteem and resilience.
