Next Week in English

Year 3

Next week, Year 3 will be using all they have learnt in this unit to invent their own action packed stories. They will make a class book so that they can share them each other.

Year 4

Year 4 are learning to create action and suspense within their stories. They will learn to include dramatic conjunctions and adverbials and imply words to create the suspense.

Year 5

Year 5 have been learning how to write outstanding openings and cliff hanger endings. This is in preparation for writing a complete warning story next week.

Year 6

Next week in English, we will be finishing our innovated stories before inventing our own action story. We will be using our writing toolkit to create our own stories. We will be learning how to use verbs to build tension.

Next Week in Maths

Year 3

Next week, Year 3 will be looking at different strategies to solve multiplication. This will include halving and doubling and the associative and distributive laws.

Year 4

Year 4 will be calculating with length, mass and capacity and duration of time (hours and minutes) before moving on to learning how to interpret discrete and continuous data.

Year 5

Next week, Year 5 will be continuing their work on comparing and ordering fractions with different denominators, as well as investigating nets and shapes.

Year 6

Next week in maths, the children will be continuing to learn about angles. They will be finding missing angles using known facts and they will also be using a protractor to accurately measure angles.
