

Pupil Premium 2017-2018

What is Pupil Premium?

The Government state that “**Pupil premium** is additional funding for publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of disadvantaged **pupils** and close the gap between them and their peers.”

Pupil Premium was introduced in April 2011 and is additional funding that is allocated to the school to support children who are looked after by the local authority and those who have been eligible for free school meals at any point in the last six years (also known as Ever 6 FSM). Pupil Premium funding is also applied to support those children who have parents in the regular armed forces.

For the academic year of 2017-2018, we received a **Pupil Premium Grant of £75,500**

- **£56600** was granted to support children who are looked after by the local authority or those receiving or have received free school meals within the last six years. This includes £1320 for each child who is recorded as free school meals or as free school meals within the last six years and £1900 for any child who is looked after or adopted from care, (this area of funding is managed by Wiltshire Local Authority Virtual Head teacher).
- **£18900** was granted to support children who have parents in the regular armed forces, which is allocated at £300 per child.

It is for schools to decide how the pupil premium allocated to their school is spent. Schools are held accountable for their use of the additional funding to support pupils and the impact this has on educational attainment.

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The Pupil Premium Grant, at Old Sarum Primary School, is being used in the following ways:
