



Sports Evaluation 2016-17

Over the past academic year £7,220 was spent on CPD for staff, £470 was spent on mini bus hire to improve attendance in level 2 competitions, £5320 to provide and support children with activities to extend school sport, £127 spent on HSSA affiliation fee which has enabled us to take part in athletics, football league competition and the dance festival and £43 was spent on the hire of facilities for Level 2 tournaments. Total Expenditure: **£12,710**.

To provide children with sufficient opportunities to apply skills to appropriate games / activity / settings.	Seven stars tournaments have been successful across KS2. Children have competed in half termly tournaments. A range of clubs provides opportunities for children to practise these skills beforehand.
