## Next Week in English

### Year 3

Next week in Year 3, we will be starting to write persuasion texts, exploring the techniques used to persuade.

### Year 4

Next week in English, Year 4 are moving on to a non-fiction unit where they will be exploring instructional texts. The pupils will examine a range of texts to help them identify the key features of this text type. The children will also plan and write a set of instructions applying the features they have discovered.

### Year 5

Year 5 will be editing and improving the endings to their warning stories next week. They will also begin to learn a new non-fiction text. The children have explored some of the features that can be found in a discussion text and will apply these skills.

### Year 6

In Year 6, we will be continuing to work as a whole class, groups and individuals to investigate different texts and answer SAT style questions. We look forward to working with the children on their reading skills.

## Next Week in Maths

### Year 3

Next week, we will be learning to solve problems, including missing number problems, involving multiplication and division. This will involve positive integer scaling problems and correspondence problems.

### Year 4

Year 4 will be learning to interpret discrete and continuous data. We will be learning to choose the best way to present it. We will be revising the properties of shape with a strong vocabulary focus. We will learn to classify and draw quadrilaterals.

### Year 5

Next week in Year 5, we will be looking at problem solving using the four operations, using reasoning and models to help us work out solutions.

### Year 6

In maths, Year 6 will be learning to reflect and translate shapes in all four quadrants of the coordinate plane.
