<p>Increase activity and enjoyment during lunch times and after school provision.</p>	<p>Holy Family offers lunchtime provision for all year groups. These clubs are run free of charge and are funded by using the sports funding premium. 2 coaches deliver these sessions.</p> <p>The school offers a wide range of after school clubs both for Key Stage One and Two. We also hold intra school competitions</p> <p>The total costing for lunch time/break time provision is £9,045.</p> <p>The total costing for after school provision £6,156.</p>	<p>Number of children that have accessed the After School clubs in 2017-2018 (Autumn –Spring term) is 58% of children on roll.</p> <p>This was a 30% increase from last year.</p> <p>All children have access to the dinner time clubs with one club targeted at low achieving pupils (Targeted through PE assessment data)</p>	<p>Children have the opportunity to participate in sports they have previously not attended.</p> <p>Children are involved in a wide range of sports which develop their fitness, social skills and discipline.</p>
<p>Increase participation in inter-schools competition</p>	<p>School pays an annual fee (£150.00) into ATSA (Atherton and Tyldesley sporting association) which provides sporting competitions across all year groups and also some teaching and learning sessions. So far this year we have accessed 14 separate competitions/events.</p> <p>We have a strong partnership with School Sports Games and are currently identified as a Gold School.</p>	<p>Total number who participated in interschool competitions is 88 children out of 242 children on roll.</p>	<p>All pupils by the end of Y6 have represented the school at an inter school level.</p>
