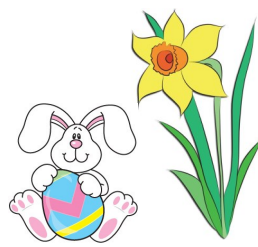


# Science

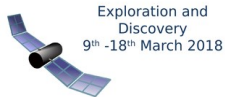

March saw the country celebrate Science with this year's theme being Exploration and Discovery. During assemblies we talked about some scientists who had helped to change our view of the world through the discoveries they had made. Our children are the future of such great discoveries. There are things not even thought of yet that will be part of their everyday lives. The first mobile phone shown on the Tomorrow's World programme illustrates this point perfectly!

Our school Science week is 21st–25th May and the theme chosen by the children is 'Food, Glorious Food'. We will spend the week looking at many aspects of food and how science is linked to its production and consumption! We will be kicking off the week with a visit from a Chocolatier who will be teaching all of the children across the school about the science of chocolate production. Our STEM challenges have looked at a range of themes linked to the Working Scientifically aspect of the National Curriculum. The children have also worked hard to make links to the other core subjects of English and Maths.
