St Cuthbert's Ofsted Section 5: We have not quite finished with our observations of our Inspection. There were some issues on attendance (of some children) and they observed some low level behavioural issues. Please read the report it says we are a Good School with Outstanding features. Please help us to get the best grade we can by supporting us with attendance and inappropriate behaviour BUT also to be positive about our school. We had a visiting head teacher and teachers from Devon in school this week who came to look at the way we work and reach the high standards we do, they were very complimentary about your children, the staff and our school.

Congratulations: To our Speech Choir who some say were the best (that was our parents!! Unbiased of course). To the many children in their sporting activities they have taken part in and doing really well, when we are put our BEST team out. To our Year 6 girls who achieved 3<sup>rd</sup> place and bronze medals for the Liverpool Small Schools Cross-Country. To our girls Netball who progressed in the cup by a 10-0 victory!!! Our Year 5/6 Indoor Athletics City Champions of Liverpool and 4<sup>th</sup> in Merseyside. Year 3/4 3<sup>rd</sup> place in City Championships. Football teams both boys and girls are having a good season that will continue next term. There are Cross-Country events the final 2 on Thursday 12 April and the following Monday 16 April.

Evacuation of school: As we know the email we received with the threat of a bomb was a HOAX. Investigations across the country (if affected hundreds of schools we are told) on how it managed to pass our Firewalls to protect us is ongoing. Once we were aware of the threat we actioned our evacuation plan which all schools need. Everything stops with priority to get our children safe. The aim is to leave the school area between 3-4 minutes. This the staff and children successfully did. We then walked up to the top of Church Road to assembly at the far end of Halfords huge carpark. As we had 2 year olds and it was cold we sought to get inside with over 200 children. I pass on mine and our families thanks to the manager of Chiquito's restaurant who invited us all in with open arms. The hoax was apparently a disgruntled teenager who did it because he could. Our families were sent text messages with an explanation of what had happened when we had the all clear from the police to return. The manager of Chiquito's complimented the staff and said our children were fantastic. I do find it a little mystifying how the Liverpool Echo had a screen shot of a text sent to afternoon foundation 1 parents. This sadly caused panic for some parents as unfounded rumours began. It did seem that some parents seem to know more than others.

Our New School: At the beginning of the new term there will be an opportunity on a number of occasions to see the proposed plans and to ask the Architect and school about this wonderful opportunity we have to build a new St Cuthbert's. It just remains for me to thank all the staff for their selfless and tireless work on behalf of you and the school. Also to wish you a wonderful Spring break with your families.
