Background
<p>The government gives extra funding to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport - is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.</p> <p><u>How to use PE and sport premium funding</u></p> <p>The premium must be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils, in the 2016 to 2017 academic year, to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles.</p> <p>This means that you should use the premium to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> develop or add to the PE and sport activities that your school already offers make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years <p>For example, you can use your funding to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> provide staff with professional development, mentoring, training and resources to help them teach PE and sport more effectively hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers to enhance or extend current opportunities introduce new sports, dance or other activities to encourage more pupils to take up sport and physical activities support and involve the least active children by providing targeted activities, and running or extending school sports and holiday clubs enter or run more sport competitions partner with other schools to run sports activities and clubs increase pupils' participation in the School Games encourage pupils to take on leadership or volunteer roles that support sport and physical activity within the school provide additional swimming provision targeted to pupils not able to meet the swimming requirements of the national curriculum embed physical activity into the school day through active travel to and from school, active playgrounds and active teaching

Our Aims:
<p><u>Through using our Sports Premium Funding we aim to:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> encourage pupils to work and play independently and with others in a range of situations. develop their knowledge and understanding of health related fitness and what is meant by a healthy lifestyle. develop a range of desirable, personal and social qualities such as sportsmanship, communication and how to be a good team member.

How will we be spending the PE & Sports Funding and who will benefit?

The Governors of Kimpton Primary School agree that the money must be used so that:

- all children benefit regardless of sporting ability;
- that staff have access to training opportunities and continued professional development and
- to assist in the development of the sports curriculum across the school, a sports specialist teaching assistant will provide continued CPD for all staff.

We have already spent this grant on:

- Introducing children to new and different sports from the national curriculum to promote inclusion for all, including those with disabilities and those with special needs
- Hiring specialist teachers and qualified sports coaches to work alongside our teachers in PE lessons
- Provide opportunities to take part in inter and intra sports competitions including Schools Games events
- Improving some of our sports equipment enabling more children to participate in a variety of sports and clubs
- Improving our links with external Community sports providers

This will impact on our children gaining new skills and experiences and our teachers learning new techniques and knowledge to aid them in teaching sport and PE.
