<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All teaching staff have received one to one support in teaching a variety of activities including gymnastics, tag rugby, hockey, , badminton, tennis, basketball, rounders, cricket, lacrosse, netball and multiskills. • Development of a team of PlayLeaders, confident to deliver activities to both younger and older children during breaktimes. • Success at both Partnership and wider competitions including Football League 2nd place, Tag Rugby winners, Oratory School Football Tournament winners plus many friendly match wins. • Very successful "Get Active" week with all children taking part in at least two different activities each day. • Sports Captains appointed who support teachers in PE lessons, produce weekly sports reports to raise the profile of sport across the school, assist with House Match team selection and assist with Get Active week, Sports Day and other sporting fixtures. • Greater awareness of sport and a healthy, active lifestyle for both children and parents via the Sports Notice Board which is updated with information and local initiatives to get involved in. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Range of afterschool clubs on offer to be increased.
