No photography in school:

Please can I remind all parents/ carers that no photography/ videos can be taken on school premises unless permission has been given for the particular event. We ask that phones are not used whilst on the school premises and this includes not taking photos when you visit the school- such as stay and play sessions, open evening and during sharing assemblies. Staff will inform you of when photography is allowed.

Earth Day – April 27th

You may recall in 2015, Templewood participated in Earth day by planting tree saplings donated by CDGNOW.



CDGNOW: Earth Restoration service will be returning to Templewood on the 27th April to restore our nature meadow (where the saplings were planted in 2015), remove winter brambles and prepare our outdoor learning area for summer by planting wild flowers with the children.

We ask that on this day all children bring wellies, if possible, so that they can participate fully in the planting of flower plugs.

Pencil cases: After Easter

From Easter we kindly ask that KS2 pupils do not bring in pencil cases. As a school we have decided that we will provide pens, pencils, rulers, rubbers, glue etc; to avoid pencil cases causing a distraction during lessons and in order to provide recommended equipment to all pupils. We are keen to provide each pupil with a recommended hand writing pen and will be encouraging higher expectations of handwriting over the next term. If your child currently uses a specific pen to aid their writing please contact your child's teacher to discuss this further. Please note there will no longer be a school shop as they children/ parents are no longer required to purchase the resources.

Mrs Brennan and Ms Halsey would like to thank you for supporting the new procedures for sending correspondence and late items into the office and using the School Gateway for payments and consent etc. Their next target is to further reduce the amount of cash and eliminate cheques so trips to the bank can be less frequent. Using the School Gateway for payments and consent will greatly reduce the workload of the school office. The system produces electronic consent lists for the teachers, finance statements for the accountant, any many other useful reports. At present, 51% of parents are using the system (31% of these parents are using the app which allows us to send text messages free of charge). NEWS FROM...

Nursery

This term Hawthorn class have been very busy learning about different types of Transport. We have designed our own vehicles out of Junk, Painted our favourite type of Transport and used our problem solving skills to sort different types of transport.

Reception

This term our topics were Transport and Growing. The children enjoyed spending time in the role play travel agents booking holidays and looking at brochures. They all took an active part in making vehicles from junk modelling which were displayed for all to see in the classroom.

The second half term saw the children learning about growing which was demonstrated so well in our class assembly. The children took an active part in telling the story, singing songs and displaying their lovely art work. We also looked closely at life cycles which included growing beans in transparent containers and observing the metamorphosis of frogs.

Year 1

This term, we have had a fantastic time learning all about plants. We started off with a very memorable performance of Jack and the Beanstalk and have finished the term by writing our own non-fiction books about plants.

Green grass and lambs grazing.*



In Maths, we have made huge progress with our understanding of Maths stories and word problems, this was greatly helped by some fantastic homework where Year 1 wrote their own Maths stories.

Year 2

Year 2 have had a great half term learning all about China, making some fantastic Chinese crafts and learning to write Chinese inspired traditional tales.

We really enjoyed all the events of book week, and were proud to have won the vote for the best door decoration. We celebrated our win by having a film afternoon with popcorn on Tuesday.



Year 3

This half term year three have been studying volcanoes in topic and linking this to our learning across the curriculum. We have been learning to write persuasively and have written letters to the Governors trying to persuade them to allow a trip to a volcano. We have also enjoyed writing poems about chocolate.

After half term we found out that we had a place in this year's dance festival and worked really hard in our PE lessons to learn the dance. On Monday 19th March we went to Campus West and performed to our parents. I would like to thank the children for their excellent behaviour whilst we were at the Campus and also for their fantastic performance; you were all brilliant and should be really proud of what you achieved in such a short time.

Year 4 - The Vicious Vikings

This term, Year 4 have enjoyed their learning on the Vicious Vikings. In English, we linked our topic learning to the book 'How to Train Your Dragon' which we used as inspiration to write instructions some of which included: 'How to Brush Your Dragon's Teeth' and 'How to Put Your Dragon to Sleep'. We also wrote diary entries from the perspective of Vikings or Monks after the raid at Lindisfarne. In Art, we made 3D longships using recycled materials as well as dragon eyes out of clay (which the children thoroughly enjoyed). Overall, it has been an exciting topic and the children have immersed themselves in their learning from the beginning to the end.

Year 5 - School trip to the British Museum- 20th March

This term, Year 5 have been learning about the Ancient Greeks. To consolidate our learning we went on a school trip to the British Museum to look at some Ancient Greek artefacts. The children were particularly interested in going to see the Parthenon exhibition as we have been debating whether or not the Elgin Marbles should be there or if they should be returned to Greece. As well as looking at the Parthenon we looked at lots of different Greek pots and compared them to the ones that we made in our art lessons. We were trying to spot Greek gods and goddesses on the pots that we had read about in myths and legends in our English lessons. As well as looking at the Ancient Greeks, we had an opportunity to look at some of the Mayan galleries in order to prepare us for our topic next term.

Year - 6 Monks Walk Science

Oak class have been to Monks Walk to experience some Science Lab work – they have been separating materials by using Bunsen burners. In addition to this, they have burnt different chemicals that gave off colourful sparks that are similar to fireworks.

The children are currently in the process of making death masks which coincides with our Egyptian topic. They have also been learning about burial chambers as well as designing and making their own ones.

Esafty update from Mrs Spragg: What are PEGI ratings?

Age ratings are systems used to ensure that entertainment content, such as games, but also films, TV shows or mobile apps, is clearly labelled with a minimum age recommendation based on the content they have. These age ratings provide guidance to consumers, parents in particular, to help them decide whether or not to buy a particular product for a child.

While most games are suitable for players of all ages, others are only suitable for older children and young teenagers. A specific portion of games on the market contain content that is only appropriate for an adult audience.

The PEGI rating considers the age suitability of a game, not the level of difficulty. A PEGI 3 game will not contain any inappropriate content, but can sometimes be too difficult to master for younger children. Reversely, there are PEGI 18 games that are very easy to play, yet they contain elements that make them inappropriate for a younger audience.

PEGI is used and recognised throughout Europe and has the enthusiastic support of the European Commission. It is considered as a model of European harmonisation in the field of the protection of children.
