We have been teaching the children to recycle milk cartons. Each week, we are assigning children to be our helping hands. They will help wash the milk cartons and put them in the recycling bin.

Bayonne Recycling Centre

We have a recycling centre set up in the reception area. You are welcome to bring your old batteries (please make sure they are not leaking), ink cartridges, ink toners and old mobile phones to our recycling centre in the reception area.

We have signed up for the Ella Cycle recycling programme. We are working with Terra Cycle to collect any brand of baby pouches and Ella Snack wrappers for recycling. Please bring in washed baby food pouches.
