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## Exciting News, Say Hello to 'Flossie'!

Several months ago, we sent a text message asking your view on whether you thought introducing a school dog was a good idea? Overall, the responses were positive with most parents thinking it was a good idea. Discussions with the staff were also very positive. Two weeks ago, our school council asked about having a school pet and as a result, I have decided to buy a Cockapoo as the Newberry family pet and Brimington's first ever school dog. Initially Flossie will be in school to be socialised. Children will be given the opportunity to stroke her if they wish. Following this period, she will undergo basic puppy training. Once complete, we will consult with professionals as to whether she can be trained as a 'Reading Dog'. There will be opportunities for all children to be involved in the caring and walking of her. My aim is for her to also provide support to children experiencing emotional difficulties and to work with our SEN children. I am very aware that some children would not like to have contact with her and that others may have medical reasons to prevent them from being involved. Our primary focus is to ensure that the welfare of Flossie is always considered, and the safety and happiness of the children are at the forefront of everything we do.


## Craft Day and Non-Uniform Day – 25<sup>th</sup> May 2018

Please ensure that if your child does suffer from travel sickness that they have taken their tablet before coming to school to avoid distress on our journey. If your child requires a tablet for the return journey please send it in an envelope labeled with your child's name and clear instructions as to when it should be taken.

A packed lunch will be required, (no glass bottles please), although if your child has free school meals, lunch will be provided by school. School uniform should be worn along with a waterproof coat and comfortable shoes. The children will not require any spending money for this trip.
