Home-school Links



Welcome back, we hope you have had a lovely Easter Break.

Whether your child is returning to school or starting school for the first time, we would like to give you some information that will help us to settle them back into school this term.

- Please make sure Nursery children come to school each day in their school uniform. We ask that you clearly label clothing with your child's name (especially jumpers!)
- If possible please ensure that your child can manage their own toileting needs. It might be useful to consider elasticated waist trousers rather than the difficult silver clips some children struggle with. We will of course support your child with toilet training. Please talk to us should you require this support.
- We encourage all of our children to be independent when they are in school. You could support us in this by teaching your child how to put on their own coat and how to wash their hands properly after using the toilet. Velcro fastening shoes are also a good idea!
- With the weather (hopefully) getting warmer and sunnier, we would ask that you send your child to school with a sun hat and sunscreen applied at home before school. For our fulltime children who bring sunscreen with them, we will ensure they make an additional application at lunchtime.

Our theme this half term will be 'The World Around Us' We will be reading lots of stories and learning about farms, farm animals, planting, growing and the environment. We will also be looking at different occupations and cultures. We will be having a special visit from a Vicar who will be showing us some of the fascinating traditions and rituals of the church. We may even get to witness a baptism of our EYFS dolls!

The Nursery visits to our fantastic library continue to be a roaring success, thoroughly enjoyed by all of the children. They love looking at the books and especially enjoy choosing a new one to take home in their own bag. Unfortunately, if children don't bring their bag with them, they can't take home a new book. You could help your child to avoid disappointment by reminding them to bring their bag and book to school every THURSDAY.

Things You can do at Home

We are continuing to focus on numbers 0-10. We are learning to recognise the numbers and beginning to order them. Perhaps you could talk about numbers at home or look for numbers whenever you are out and about eg house numbers, numbers on cars or buses, numbers in the supermarket.
