CLJ	Summer Topic - 'Kings and Queens' A focus on the significant British monarchs in history, that gives a more in-depth study of Richard III as well as asking the children to draw comparisons between Elizabeth I and Queen Victoria. The unit consolidates the children's awareness of the past and significant individuals through using timelines and making comparisons between various periods in history. The children will also learn about castles and their role in history.

Homework expectations	Homework will be given out on Fridays to be returned on Wednesdays.  Spellings will be given on a Friday to be tested on a Friday. It is very important for children to become good spellers and they will be tested on spellings related to their phonic, high frequency words and

I also assess children's spelling in their independent writing therefore some spellings may be simple or often repeated to ensure children are correctly applying them consistently.</p> <p>Please hear your child read at home every day. Children should read their school books but are encouraged to supplement their reading by exploring a range of texts at home. This will help them develop a love for reading and explore a variety of genres. Any texts your child chooses to read can be recorded in their reading diary.</p>
