Next Week in English

Year 3

Next week in English, we will be exploring how to write a legend, focussing on characterisation. We will be creating and describing characters and using them to begin to write our own version of a legend.

Year 4

Next week, the pupils in Year 4 will be continuing their work on myths. They will explore and use comparative and superlative adjectives. Pupils will also review the use of apostrophes in contractions. They will adapt the myth they have learnt to create an alternative version.

Year 5

In literacy, next week, Year 5 will be writing their own wishing tales based on Charlie and the Golden Coin. The children have had some very exciting ideas that we are looking forward to reading.

Year 6

In English, we are continuing to improve our reading comprehension skills and undertaking preparation for SATS.

Next Week in Maths

Year 3

Next week, Year 3 will be adding and subtracting fractions with the same denominators.

Year 4

Year 4 will be learning the decimal equivalences to tenths, hundredths, $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{1}{2}$, and $\frac{3}{4}$, they will round decimal numbers to nearest whole numbers and \times and \div by 10 and 100.

We will then be calculating using decimals. We will use strategies previously learnt, for example; finding complements to 1; regrouping and formal written methods.

Year 5

Next week in Maths, Year 5 will be learning about Area, calculating this from missing lengths and using known facts, square and cubed numbers to investigate Area further.

Year 6

Year 6 will be learning how to solve problems involving fractions and how to interpret line graphs and pie charts.
