Introduction

The School Improvement Plan seeks to underpin the direction the school is taking, by setting out a practical basis on which the school can achieve its aims. To enable school to provide the 'best possible education for its pupils' it must undergo a process of self-review in which everyone is encouraged to participate. Self-evaluation provides the Headteacher, Governors and Staff team with knowledge of the strengths and weaknesses of the school so that appropriate priorities for the ongoing improvement of the school can be set. Its ultimate aim is to improve outcomes for all pupils to Outstanding (Ofsted categorisation) and through self-review to maintain the school at this level of excellence. The School Governors monitor the progress against our plan on a regular basis.

- 2. To improve progress for all pupils**


