Next Week in English

Year 3

This week Year 3 will be writing our own legends similar to our class text 'Romulus and Remus'. Our focus will still be on creating great characters. We are also practising using apostrophes for possession.

Year 4

In English next week Year 4 are continuing their work on myths. They will be using what they have learnt to plan and write their own myths, focusing on using characterisation to engage readers in their writing.

Year 5

Wishes are being granted in Year 5's English lessons next week, as the children are writing their own wishing stories. They have come up with some great ideas already.

Year 6

Next week in English, the children will be revising key concepts prior to their SATs.

Next Week in Maths

Year 3

Next week we will be continuing our work on fractions, looking at fractions of continuous quantities and problem solving.

Year 4

Year 4 will be learning to calculate with decimals. We will learn to find complements to 1 and will then use regrouping for addition and subtraction. We will then learn to use formal written methods and compare the strategies.

Year 5

In Year 5 maths, we will be learning about and investigating volume and capacity, drawing on the real life application of knowledge and an understanding of cubed numbers.

Year 6

Next week in maths, the children will be revising key concepts prior to their SATs.
