

Pupil Premium Statement 2014/15

The Pupil Premium is additional funding given to schools so that they can support particular groups of pupils who are known to be at risk of underachievement and close the attainment gap between them and their peers. Pupil Premium is allocated to schools for pupils in Foundation to Year 6 who are or have ever been eligible for free school meals (FSM). There is a smaller amount allocated for children in Local Authority care (LAC) and children of service families.

It is for schools to decide how the pupil premium is spent, however, schools are held accountable for how they use this additional funding to support children from low income families. From September 2012 schools have been obliged to publish this information on the school website. Please see below information regarding how this funding has been spent for the 14/15 year, and the impact of this funding.

Pupil Premium Expenditure April 2014 – March 2015

Expenditure was based on research and data analysis provided by The Sutton Trust, Raise Online and Fisher Family Trust.

- School has an inclusion manager who also has responsibility for overseeing the progress and well-being of pupils deemed to be vulnerable.
- Part of the pupil premium each year is used to ensure that the inclusion manager has time to closely track these pupils. This includes tracking of data, working with teachers to plan appropriate interventions and working with small groups and individuals who need support with their learning.
- Outreach worker – Action in Rural Sussex COPES: to build on strong relationships with parents and carers and help families and pupils having specific relationship/pastoral/social difficulties
- Funding for enrichment activities, e.g. swimming, school trips, clubs.
- Additional individual or small group tuition programmes or TA support.
- Resources to support learning across the curriculum including phonics intervention programme and reading scheme, Sums Up maths intervention.

Progress & Impact:

Each child at KS1 is expected to make 12 points progress from end of reception class to end of KS1. Each child at KS2 is expected to make 12 points progress from the end of KS1 to the end of KS2. Any additional points made would be considered accelerated progress (value added).

The Future:

Looking Ahead: The School is committed to improving achievement of all pupils and narrowing the gaps between outcomes of children eligible for FSM and others.

The Pupil Premium allocation for 2015/16 is £16,440.

We plan to spend this money on the continuation of successful strategies employed last year alongside planned new interventions.

- Continued provision of additional TA/INA support
- Professional services such as Language & Learning Support, Ed Psychology, PSHE support
- Small group intervention work such as Sums Up, Sum Dog and Phonics Boosters
- Inclusion/equal access for all
- Wider opportunities including after school clubs such as Zylo Performance, Le Tennis, Science Club
- ICT resources (2 thinkpads for research) and additional resources to improve reading such as kindles, subscriptions to First News
