Dos and Don'ts for Pupils in FS/ KS1



These top tips show you how you can be careful when you go on the internet. We want to help you to know what to do if anyone is nasty to you and how you can be safer when you talk to people online, play games online or when you use your mobile. This will help you and your friends be safer online and make sure that you know what to do if you are ever scared or unhappy about something online.

- Always ask a grown up before you use the internet. They can help you find the best thing to do.
- Don't tell strangers where you live, your phone number or where you go to school. Only your friends and family need to know that.
- Don't send pictures to people you don't know. You don't want strangers looking at photos of you, your friends or your family.
- Tell a grown up if you feel scared or unhappy about anything.
