

## Sports and Physical Education Report Spring Term 2017/2018

As always we are continuing to strive to achieve more in sports for the children and parents of St Johns.

As stated last report, in our sports funding evaluation completed last year we identified some key next steps that we have continued to work on already this year.

- Competitions are looked at in advance to plan cover so St Johns can attend more events.
- Marc Hyatt and Marie Wargent (DHT) now meet weekly to go over PE and competitions in the absence of Sophie Monk

Attendance at competitions is again a priority to include as many children in sporting events as possible and to increase the awareness and enjoyment of sports. From the data we collect we can see that we are already on target to achieving this.

Over the past two terms St John's has attended 9 events, these have included festivals and competitions within the Carterton partnership, including representation at two West Oxfordshire finals for Netball and Hockey.

Sporting success over the past two terms has included the Carterton Partnership U11 Rugby, U11 Netball, U11 Boys Football and U11 Girls Football, all of which we came first place. After representing at the West Oxfordshire finals for both Hockey and Netball we are happy to announce we came 3<sup>rd</sup> in both competitions. The school Gymnastics teams have also qualified for the Oxfordshire school games finals for the third year in a row.

We have again been looking closely at our tracking to include and invite as many children to competitions, compared to previous years, this is also part of the criteria for our School Games Mark. We then identify those who have not yet attended a competition to support them and engage them in sports through intra competitions and clubs to encourage them to take part in competitions. Through this system the result so far has been very encouraging.

From the table above, we can see that we have made progress towards ensuring more children than in the previous year have now attended a competition outside of school. The feedback from these children has been very positive and they have enjoyed the events. This is showing that the systems St Johns has in place are effective in targeting children to become more active and engage more in sports.

- Overall in four terms we can already see that 75% of children from Year 3 – 6 (sporting competitive age) that hadn't previously taken part in a competition have now done so.

We have already identified which children will be invited to competitions in Term 5 and 6 based on the clubs they have attended and the sporting interest they have shown during P.E. sessions and lunchtime activities to ensure the progress above continues in all Year groups with a focus on Year 3 to 6.

- **Sporting Equipment.**

Last term, we were able to purchase four new netball posts for the playground, these are proving really popular at break times. This also means that we can host Netball matches for our Netball league in term 6.

We also obtained new sports tops for the children to wear to competition. As we take so many children to competitions now it is nice that they can all wear a St John's top to make them all feel they are part of our school team. As well as buying badges for our sport leaders, we were pleased to also buy Sports Captain badges for the first time. We looked at children who were outstanding leaders in their favourite sports and rewarded them for their hard work and dedication.

Work has started on our new MUGA sports facility which will be completed by the end of May.

- **Additional Provision**

After raising awareness of Young Carers last term, we were very excited to start a young carers sports club which is planned for the end of each term. At the end of this term we were really pleased to take the group of 18 children to the climbing wall at Carterton Community College which they did not charge for and included an experienced climbing instructor for the afternoon. The children really enjoyed it and the feedback from parents was extremely positive.

Next term we will be running additional swimming lessons with qualified instructors at the Carterton Leisure Centre. In Term 5 we will be taking Year 5 pupils and in Term 6 we will be taking Year 6 swimmers. Each group will get 6 additional lessons in small groups. Children have been selected based on in school assessments including their ability to confidently swim 25 metres.
