


## Whalley CE Primary School Pupil Premium Statement 2018-19



Pupil Premium was introduced in April 2011. We currently receive three bands of funding; children from income-challenged families who are known to be eligible for Free School Meals; Looked After Children and children from Forces Families. The funding is provided to provide targeted support for these groups of children and others who may require additional support.

In 2016-17 Whalley CE Primary School expects to receive £31,313

Analysis of the school tracking data and discussions with children, parents and teachers has identified several areas where children receiving pupil premium may require additional support. These include:

- 1) 'Narrowing the gap' for children making slow or no progress or working below age related expectations.
- 2) Supporting children working above age related expectations to make accelerated progress.
- 3) Supporting behavioural, social and emotional problems.
- 4) Identifying and helping families to access agencies outside school.
- 5) Providing financial support to ensure every child has access to educational visits.
- 6) Providing enrichment opportunities within and outside school.
- 7) Improving attendance and lateness.
- 8) Staff training to help support individual needs.

How we intend to spend the money in 2018-19.

Target Area	Action	Indicative Cost
Behaviour/Social/Emotional/attendance Support	Employ Learning Mentor to support children through Wide Awake Club, Lunchtime Chill Zone, 1 to 1 support sessions and provide signposting and referrals to support agencies.	£21,000
Academic Support	Provide training in intervention programmes. Provide 1 to 1 and focus group work through targeted TA/teacher support or with a specialist teacher to close gaps in learning/provide enhancement opportunities.	£4500
Ensure all children have access to a full curriculum	Subsidising costs of educational visits and curriculum enrichment.	£1,500
To promote self-esteem, self-confidence and provide new opportunities	Provide access to enrichment programmes such as after-school clubs, music lessons, organised groups	£2,000
To provide support for specific identified needs	Access to specialist support/assessment through IDSS, therapists, Ed Psych etc.	£2,000
To provide uniform for families who require financial support.	To provide 2 badged school jumpers and a book bag for each child.	£350
