JRSO/Wheels Week



Next Week in English

Year 3

In English next week, we will be beginning to write non-fiction in order to give information. We will focus on the difference between formal and informal writing and using conjunctions and adverbs to vary our sentences.

Year 4

Next week, Year 4 will be using drama to explore a new myth. They will identify features which help to create action and suspense in the myth. In addition, pupils will analyse and answer questions about the myth, developing their ability to support their answers with evidence from the text. Pupils will also revise and consolidate their use of speech punctuation.

Year 5

Year 5 will be looking at the different ways an author gives us clues about a character's personality and how these may change during the story.

Year 6

Next week, Year 6 will be learning to write an information leaflet. The classes will have to structure the information clearly and include modal verbs, commands, subordinate clauses and a range of punctuation.

Next Week in Maths

Year 3

Next week, Year 3 will be dividing two and three-digit numbers by one digit numbers. We will revise what we already know about place value and also look at finding halves.

Year 4

Year 4 will be solving routine and non-routine problems using decimals. They will then be exploring models for finding fractions of quantities and fractional reasoning to solve whole unknown problems.

Year 5

Next week, Year 5 will be consolidating their knowledge of angles through investigation and problem solving.

Year 6

The children in Year 6 are consolidating their knowledge of mathematical concepts that have been taught throughout the year.
