

# Spending the Sports Grant Funding

## How will we be spending the Sports Funding and who will benefit?

The Governors agree that the money must be used in our pursuit of excellence for all children: every child will benefit from additional opportunities; our most able children will be given further opportunities which will enable them to benefit from subject specialist high level coaching so they are able to compete in advanced tournaments; in addition staff will have access to training opportunities and continued professional development.

The following shows how we spent the sports funding during 2017-2018.

- Three whole terms of gymnastics and athletics coaching (First for Sports) for all children in years FS2 – 6, including after school sports provision
- Coaching for the further development of our extra-curricular gymnastics club
- PE teacher support, coaching and attendance at sports events, including weekends, to develop team sports
- Swimming subsidy to ensure every child has the experience of swimming each year.
- Fees for participating within chosen events in the local sports affiliation hub. This allowed access to events/tournament opportunities across 3 terms of sports coaching
- Fee for specialist taught dance lessons for all children, including the cost of the 2018 Corn Exchange Dance Choreography Challenge for children in years 4 – 6
- The purchase of sports equipment to further enhance the teaching of PE and after-school sports clubs

In 2017-18 our allocation was £13081. The total cost for PE teaching/sports coaching and the Sports Affiliation fees amounted all children was £6285. The School subsidised swimming lessons for all children in the autumn term which meant all children could attend swimming at a reduced cost as they do each year. Contributions towards our specialist dance teacher including dance coaching for our Summer production, Nativity Barn Service and the School's Choreography Challenge amount to £3976.25. The new hockey, gymnastic, netball, playground markings and certified certificates (British Gymnastics) amounts to £3668.30.

Miscellaneous items including PE kit and motivational awards for increased participation amounted to £509.55

## **Impact of funding**

Improved outcomes in children's achievement and attainment in gymnastics.

Attendance at after school sports clubs this year has been in excess of 80%. There has been an increase on last year.

The school netball teams have been formed this year and participated in tournaments and fixtures across local schools.

Teams from Enborne have participated and medalled this year in tournaments and events such as: netball, cross country, gymnastics and others.

Children across the school demonstrate high levels of achievement and motivation in dance. Our Enborne Primary Dance Club is a very popular clubs amongst the children and is attended by an increasing number of boys in KS2.

### **2018-19**

We are continuing with our current arrangements into 2018-19 using First for Sports providing our sports coaching for one afternoon each week with after school club provision. This also includes attendance and participation at The Park House sports affiliation tournaments and competitions.

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
