Snow and Bad Weather Policy

In the event of disruption caused by heavy snow the prime concern of the school must always be the safety of pupils and staff.

The decision to close the school will take into account the safety of all our pupils and staff, some who travel a distance to school each day. We will always endeavour to open the school in the event of bad weather, as long as it is safe to do so.

In the event of bad weather, parents should check whether the school is open before travelling to the site. There are a number of ways to confirm whether the school is open or closed.

- Listen for school closures on local radio
 - BBC Radio Humberside – 95.9 (**this is the one we will phone**)
 - Viking Radio – 96.9
 - KCFM – 99.8
 - Capital – 105.9

- Check the list of school closures on the East Riding Council website:

- Check text messages as a message will be sent to using our Teachers2Parents messaging service to the first contact we hold.

If the school is closed, we will try and make a decision as early as possible, and will intend to reopen as soon as we can.

If the school does open, but extreme weather develops during the day, we will aim to remain open until the end of the normal school day. However this is not always possible when roads are becoming treacherous. In which case parents will be contacted via text message using our Teachers2Parents service and asked to collect their children as soon as possible. Under these conditions we will take verbal permission for their child/children to be collected by a nominated adult. Normal lessons may be curtailed and the remaining pupils assembled in groups under supervision of authorized members of staff to await collection.

Staff will always take reasonable effort to undertake the journey to school. It is appreciated that the journey may take longer than normal and therefore some staff may not be able to arrive before the normal start of the school day. It may also be necessary to ask all children to bring packed lunches if the kitchen staff are unable to reach school safely.

The school has a gritting plan which is on the school website and also kept in the school office. In severe weather, a decision will be made as to whether to open the car park gate for vehicle access.
