## Fortnite

We are aware that a lot of children are accessing this game at home. The following information has been brought to our attention about the game and I think it is worth sharing it with parents:

*The NSPCC and O2 have launched new advice for parents amid concerns over a game function that automatically allows users to speak to other players through voice and text chat functions. It means children can be contacted by anyone else who is playing the game. Users can disable voice chat in the game via the settings menu, but the text chat function cannot be turned off.*

*Research from NSPCC and O2, of 2,059 children and young people aged 11-18, reveals that that one in four children have been contacted online by someone they don't know.*

As always, it is important for parents to be aware of the functions of computer games and to regularly talk to their children about how to stay safe online.

Good luck to Year 4 who will be competing in the annual Year 4 Catholic Athletics competition when they come back from half term. This is a great opportunity for the children to meet, and compete against, children from within our Catholic network of local schools. Year 5 will be attending 'Picnic and Praise' this year alongside other Catholic primary schools in the diocese which is another opportunity for the children to meet children from other schools.
