<p>Drug, alcohol and tobacco education: Making choices</p> <p>Pupils learn:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • that there are drugs (other than medicines) that are common in everyday life, and why people choose to use them • about the effects and risks of drinking alcohol • about different patterns of behaviour that are related to drug use <p>Asthma lesson for Year 2, 3 or 4</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • that medicines can be used to manage and treat medical conditions such as asthma, and that it is important to follow instructions for their use 	<p>Keeping safe and managing risk: Playing safe</p> <p>Pupils learn:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • how to be safe in their computer gaming habits • about keeping safe near roads, rail, water, building sites and around fireworks • about what to do in an emergency and basic emergency first aid procedures 	<p>Careers, financial capability and economic wellbeing: Saving, spending and budgeting</p> <p>Pupils learn:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • about what influences people’s choices about spending and saving money • how people can keep track of their money • about the world of work
