Impact of PE and Sport Premium 2016-2017

Following a 58% increase in 2015-16, parents reported further new uptake in 5 sports. Building on the success of the previous year, 22% of all respondents noted new uptake in sport, particularly football, swimming and dance.

Fairfield School is now an official partner of Bury Football Club and Manchester City Football Club.

Children in Years 1 to 6 had access to 12 different sports during 2016/2017.
